

Where to meet people

There are different places in Bernhausen, Harthausen and Sielmingen where you can -over a cup of tea- meet fellow refugees and German people and with a bit of luck make new friends. For more details look at the pinboard of your accommodation.

Leisure activities

Bikes

At 8 Sielminger Hauptstraße in Sielmingen On every 1st and 3rd Saturday of the month there is a bike workshop (“**BIKE FIX**”) from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. For a small fee of 15 € you can get a used bike there or someone will help you with smaller repairs of your bike.

Shopping in the supermarket

The local supermarket “Netto” has weekly special offers for food and other useful things. The prices of these offers are mostly much cheaper than normally. They are valid for only this special week.

„Tafelladen“ and „Diakonieladen“

51 Echterdinger Straße in Bernhausen People with only very little income (refugees as well as Germans) can shop here at very low prices. To be admitted to the “Tafelladen” you need a special ID. Ask the social workers how to get that ID.

Public transport

There are regular and quick bus services to all parts of Filderstadt. The suburban train (“S-Bahn”) will take you to Stuttgart in about 30 minutes. It runs every 30 minutes.

Please: Do not travel without a valid ticket. There are ticket inspections every now and then. If you can't show a valid ticket you must pay a fine of 60.00 €!

Going to the doctor's

While waiting for your recognition as a refugee you have got health insurance for acute illnesses. The warden will give you the necessary insurance paper. (see opening hours). Only when you have got this paper you can go to the doctor's.
